About the Program

The Communication and Culture Program is a comprehensive four-week program, which is ideal for participants of all English levels who want an intensive, communicative learning experience. This program is offered in both winter and summer and focuses on American culture and conversational fluency. The core classes are U.S. Society and Culture, Intercultural Research Project, Listening and Pronunciation, and Everyday Expressions and Idioms. Elective classes (e.g., Academic Preparation Skills, Business Communication Skills and Critical Thinking) may be offered at the advanced levels. Program highlights include:

- Offered four times per year: January, February, July and August
- Open to students of all English proficiency levels (beginning to advanced)
- Small classes (14-18 students) for high interaction among instructors and students
- Highly qualified and experienced instructors
- Daily recreational, cultural and social activities
- Optional weekend trips to Napa Valley, Yosemite National Park, San Francisco and Los Angeles

Students will:

- Gain confidence and skills in speaking and listening
- Strengthen pronunciation and verbal presentation skills
- Learn more about American culture and customs
- Practice American English natural speech patterns and idioms

U.S. Society and Culture

- Increase your knowledge of American values and attitudes, institutions, history and culture through readings, discussion, exposure to a variety of media and journal writing
- Build a foundation of specific vocabulary in order to actively participate in discussions
- Better understand American culture as well as other students' cultures

Intercultural Research Project

- Develop questions to research a topic of cultural interest
- Gather information by interviewing native English speakers on and off campus
- Analyze and organize project information
- Prepare, practice and give a poster presentation

Listening and Pronunciation

- Improve skills through directed practice in various areas of pronunciation
- Strengthen listening comprehension through dictation, exercises, note taking and other activities
- Meet with conversation partners (UC Davis students) in small groups once a week, in this class or another class, to practice speaking and listening skills in a more informal atmosphere

- Discuss the cultural context of American expressions and idioms, and gain a deeper understanding of American culture by improving knowledge of informal speech patterns of Americans
